The George Washington University School of Public Health and Health Services is offering a new Master of Public Health (MPH) degree in Environmental Health Science and Policy beginning in Summer/Fall 2009. The program's coursework emphasizes the workings of the public health regulatory systems and the science that informs policy decisions. The practicum component places students in government agencies or in organizations that address environmental health issues.

The George Washington University faculty members are at the center of national and global conversations about using science to protect workers and the public from environmental hazards. Our faculty's wealth of experience and our low faculty-to-student ratio allow us to provide each student with personalized attention as we help them plan field placements and careers that suit their personal goals.

MPH classes are scheduled in the late afternoons and early evenings, allowing students to be employed while they earn their degrees. While taking classes, students work in a wide range of agencies, institutions, and advocacy organizations, including:

- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- Environmental Defense Fund
- Natural Resources Defense Council
- The National Academies, including the Institute of Medicine and the National Research Council
